# Meeting Summary

## 50<sup>th</sup> Olympic Board Meeting

19 May 2011

### **Minutes:**

The Minutes of the 49<sup>th</sup> Olympic Board meeting were agreed.

### **Performance Report:**

The Olympic Board noted the good progress that continues to be made across the programme, including:

- Hadleigh Farm (London 2012 Mountain Bike Venue) completed on time and budget - 23 March;
- Olympic Stadium construction completed on 29 March;
- Olympic Village's first residential plot completed, 31 March;
- Announcement that International Paralympic Day 2011 will be held in Trafalgar Square;
- Shortlist of bidders to purchase London 2012 Olympic Village announced;
- International Inspiration programme reaches 10.8 million children worldwide;
- Announcement that a new carbon-reduction scheme will be introduced around the Olympic Park, and photovoltaic cells will be installed on the Main Press Centre;
- 500 days to the Paralympic Games marked by Sainsbury's launching its '1 Million Kids Challenge' to get children involved in Paralympic sport;
- First match played at London 2012 Handball Arena on 14 April 20;
- Last tile laid in the Aquatics Centre on 18 April;
- Lee Valley White Water Centre opened to the public on 19 April;
- First round of Olympic Ticket sales completed on 26 April;
- Construction started at the Royal Artillery Barracks, Woolwich (2012 Shooting and Paralympic Archery venue) on 10 May;
- Paralympic Games ticket prices announced on 11 May;
- Construction of Handball Arena completed on 12 May.

### **Legacy Communications**

GODRIC SMITH, Director of Communications at the Government Olympic Executive, outlined how the programme is already delivering a lasting legacy from the London 2012 Olympic Games and Paralympic Games, including: the completion of the Transport Big Build on 1 June, the infrastructure and facilities on the Olympic Park that will be available for the public to use after the Games, the Westfield development, and plans

for the School Games. It was agreed that the legacy left from the 2012 Games will set it apart from all previous Games.

### **London 2012 Amendment Bill**

THE MINISTER FOR SPORT AND THE OLYMPICS updated on the recent progress of the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Amendment Bill through the House of Commons Committee stage, recognising the cross-party support it received.

### **Plans for 1 Year to Go**

JACKIE BROCK-DOYLE presented plans for “1 Year To Go” until the Olympic Games, outlining the events that will precede the 27<sup>th</sup> of July and the plans for the day itself. A number of events will take place throughout the day to mark the event across a range of media.

### **Ticketing**

JACKIE BROCK-DOYLE noted that the ticketing process was on track, with the data currently being analysed, and LOCOG will inform applicants on the outcome of their application within the stated time frame. Once the first round process is complete a second round will provide further opportunities to apply for tickets. The price structure for Paralympic Tickets was announced on 11 May and applications will be accepted between 9 September and 30 September 2011.

### **School Games**

THE CHAIR noted that to date, over 2,600 schools have registered interest in the School Games and welcomed the fact that Paralympic sport will be played in schools, allowing disabled and non-disabled children to play sport on an equal basis.

### **Games Wide Testing and Exercise Plan**

DAVID BROOKER presented the programme for Games-wide Testing and Exercising which will ensure that decision-taking and information-sharing processes are tested, alongside testing of the sports venues, before the Games.
